It provides additional stories to illustrate those already provided in the postcards.

"This scripture uses the word lavish. What does this word mean?"


If you have more than one child under your care, you can have them repeat to each other "God is my Father. God is your Father. God is our Father."

I am chosen

Everything that was created began as an idea. That is how God knew us before we were born. And then He chose us.

If we want to know who we are or who we ought to be, we could look at what our friends like about us or even what the world says we should be. We could choose to see what they prefer and try to be more like their preferences so that we can belong in their group. You know what? That identity will always fall short of the person God dreamed us to be. Because our friends' preferences will change.

What if we decide our identity on what we feel? Our feelings are really strong, surely they can help us know who we are and help us choose? If we try to define who we are by what our friends like, we can be hurt when they reject us when their preferences change. If we try to define ourselves by what our feelings point to, when our feelings change we will keep trying to generate those feelings so that we can hold onto the identity we curated for ourselves.

We turn to the one who had the original idea about us. We turn to the one whose work at creation was perfectly beautiful. We turn to the one who had an idea at the beginning of time about each person. We turn to Our Father who chose us even then.

Questions to prompt discussion

- 1. When were you chosen for something?
- 2. What did you have to do to get chosen?
- 3. What do you think this means, that God chose you before your mother and father knew you?

Discussions around this postcard today could start with speaking about anticipating something fun or exciting. Like a birthday or Christmas! Talk especially about planning towards this exciting moment and how this relates to being able to see something before it becomes a reality.

Some days you may forget to give them an affirmation. Some days you might have a difficult day react and hurt them. I pray that you will be comforted by this same truth that you shared or will share with them today. You too are a blessing. In the aftermath of the heated moment it might not look like it. However this is exactly why I need you to remember this truth , in the same way that you would like your child to know that they are a blessing, God wants you to know that you too are a blessing.

We are all wonderfully made. Think about how our different organs work together without us having to think about it. We breathe in and out. Our brains think. Our mouths talk. Our ears hear. Our bodies dance. God thought, planned and designed everything about us intricately to make our bodies work the way they do. We are wonderfully made. He loved us when we were just a thought and He loves us now.

Discussion around this postcard could build up from yesterday's conversations and a few fun facts like,

- Did you know that if you were to lay out all the arteries, capillaries and veins in one adult, end-to-end, they would stretch about 100,000 kilometres. Given that the earth's circumference is 40,075 KM, this is approximately 2 and a half times ground the earth!
- There are more nerve cells in the human brain than there are stars in the Milky Way.
- If we lined up all the neurons in our body, it would be around 965 km long.
- The human liver is involved in 500 different functions.
- The average adult carries approximately 3.6 kilograms and 2 square meters of skin.
- On average, an adult male's lungs can hold roughly 6 litres of air. This is about as much as three 2-liter soda bottles.

PRAYER:

Our Father, I pray that I and my kids grow in knowing that you are a careful and caring creator and that everything that was created by You is wonderful. May we love and serve You with our whole hearts. Grace me with the strength and presence of mind to nurture, equip, train and empower my children to do more for Your kingdom than I and they can imagine! Amen.

I belong to God

This affirmation is slowly growing into being a favourite one of mine. I love it because it led me to realize that I can involve my younger son in unpacking the information on the cards. Recently, I asked him whether he remembers how he once unpacked it to me. He did not. I asked him to share with me how he understands it now and this is what he said

"If I own a dog, it belongs to me. I give it freedom and free will to go and play. If it gets hurt, it comes back to me. When it is hungry it comes to me."

Me: "What does it do when it sees you?"

Him: "It is happy and wags it tail."

And we both pretend we have tails that wag our bodies.

Having our children lead the conversation might not always be theologically correct. However, it is important to encourage them to lead the conversation because simply it keeps it fun. It also helps you appreciate how they are engaging with what you are sharing with them. It enables them to start realizing that they, just like Samuel did, can hear from God.

Pick elements from what they share to emphasize what you would like them to remember. Most importantly, find something in what they have said or even in their effort to affirm them. Remember, the aim is not perfection but to connect and grow.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know our Father who lets us choose to whom we belong. May you all get an intimate understanding of what it means to belong to the one who created everything and therefore owns everything. May you grow to love and serve God with all of your heart. I am valued

Have you ever played the game "Would you rather?"

My younger son loves playing this game with me and he loves making the choices impossible for me. Like

"Would you rather be in jail for five years or in a coma for a decade?"

"Would you rather lose your sight or lose your memories?"

"Would you rather live in the Sahara Desert or in Antarctica?"

"Would you rather buy 10 things you don't need every time you go shopping or always forget the one thing that you need?"

"Would you rather vomit on your hero or have your hero vomit on you?"
Yeah. I am with you, rolling my eyes at the last one. I did say that my child is a boy, didn't I?

What is great about these questions is they get you thinking about what you value. Sometimes I try to negotiate and haggle my way into adding options which I prefer and include what I value. Most times he refuses to allow me to add anything. Other times I try to duck the question by asking him what his choice is. Either way, as he is getting older and his ability to search for these questions on the internet improves, the choices are ever more difficult.

Perhaps our Heavenly Father was faced with a "would you rather" situation at one time. Could He have been asked if He would rather have His son rejected and die for all of mankind to live OR - ?Did He wait to hear the option or did He think whatever was the alternative was not worth considering? I do not know. All I know is that if what He chose showed what He valued, then you and I are valued extremely highly by Him. We are precious to Him.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in trust of a Father who is giving. May you all come to the realization that if God values you highly, who are you to think otherwise? May you all know, love and serve God with your whole hearts. May you nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they could possibly imagine!

My mind is precious to God

I find that this card has a lot in it. You see, the mind is where our intellect resides, our ability to choose reigns and our imagination finds flight.

What you will find is the information that you expose yourself to and what takes up your mindshare influences what you do from day to day. It influences what choices you make, whether God choices, good choices or other choices. It therefore affects what you will choose to learn more about. It influences whether you will use your powerful imagination to build castles of worry and anxiety or provide solutions from a foundation of hope and full of faith.

This is a good card to allow your kids to lead the discussion. Questions that can aid the conversation include the ones listed below. Stay curious and do not judge! Remember the aim is to affirm while engaging in conversation and building a relationship with the kids.

- Given what we have discovered in the cards before this one, why do you think God cares about your mind?
- What topics are currently trending?
- Who do you follow on social media? What do you like about this person?
- What channels are you subscribed to? What do you like about these channels?

Asking your children to share what they like about a person, or a channel, gives you a glimpse into what they value at this moment. You may then use the answers to have them speak about what they could do to filter or find content that embodies similar values, if the values align with the conversation about why God might care.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in trust of a Father who is caring. May you all know without a shadow of a doubt that God finds your mind to be powerful and precious and wants it to be protected. May you all know, love and serve God with all your mind and all your heart. May you nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they could possibly imagine!

I am not my mistakes

It is easy to faithfully go through the previous cards and get to the point where we realize that God is good but when we compare ourselves to Him, we fall short. Terribly. Aaaaand we have the evidence to prove it. Look at all the mistakes that we have made! Even when we try to do the right thing, we still do the wrong thing. Or we do the right thing at the wrong time. Sometimes it feels like we are destined to fail the exam even before we have taken it. So deeply ingrained is our inability to do the right thing that this must mean we are doomed before we even start.

Breathe. Take a deep really long breath.

God, He who created us, is the only one who can sustain our spiritual life. He is the only one who keeps us believing in Him, in His nature in what He says of us. His love for us moves Him to call us and keep us guiltless. What we are called to do is to trust His commitment, pray for Him to keep us and wait patiently for Him to work.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know that God's power to keep you began before creation, is happening now and will never end (Psalm 121:3-8). May you all grow to love and serve God with your whole heart and mind. May God grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

That which makes our Father God and not us is what makes Him unable to come down on us with wrath. His heart is full of compassion. Think of it this way, a father who has a child who is suffering from a horrible disease, hates the disease because of what it does to the child he loves. He does not hate the child. Because of the presence of the disease, he is moved much more deeply to love the suffering child.

It is not our loveliness that wins God's love, it is our unloveliness. Unfortunately, this is not how most of us have been brought up. We have been brought up to face rejection when we fall short of set standards. We have encountered anger in response to misdeeds. As a result we may grow to think that a perfect and Holy God will be disgusted by us. And yet God himself tells us that His compassion grows warm and tender in light of our sins.

Take time to discuss why this is a hard truth to receive.

You may also study Hosea chapter 11 which talks about God's love for His children.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know our Father's heart of all-encompassing love. May you all grow to love and serve Him with your whole heart and mind. May God grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

God is with me

Like all the earlier assurances, this is a promise to those who are believers in Jesus Christ. Many things can happen that can lead our kids to feel sad, hopeless and alone. My youngest son had many such experiences to share. Feeling sad after submitting an assignment that resulted in a very low mark. Feeling hopeless at failing to understand certain concepts and dealing with it by banging his head against walls. Feeling ostracized and alone because he would cry whenever he would get overwhelmed with emotions.

I know for most parents and guardians reading this, you have your own stories of your child's heartbreak. You have seen them sad. You have heard the hopelessness in their voices. You have watched them stand off to one side in a house full of their peers, alone. You might have wanted them to snap out of it believing that when they became adults it would not matter.


However, if we took a moment to be honest with ourselves and raised our own lives to compare our moments of heartbreak against our children's we will see clear similarities in our sadness, hopelessness and aloneness. It takes a certain level of growing in spiritual maturity to remember a promise from God such as this one. He is with us. Even though our situation does not look like His love. Even though today may be difficult and we fear that the future will only get worse, this fear cannot and does not separate us from God's love and neither does it show that God has departed from us. The truth is God is with us in our joyous occasions and in our sad occasions. He especially uses the sad ones to draw us closer to Him.

Nothing. Absolutely nothing can separate us from our heavenly Father.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in the security of our heavenly Father's love. May you all grow to love and serve Him with all your hearts and minds. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

God is always near

How do you determine what is absolutely true? Could it be based on the fact that you can hear it and it sounds a certain way. Could it be because it has a very specific smell and taste? Or perhaps something is absolutely true because you see it here right in front of you and you can feel it? Your senses give you evidence of what is real and therefore must be true, right?

Have you ever been in a situation where you cannot depend on your senses to rightly tell you which direction is up or down, right or left? Pilots have to be trained to overcome this phenomenon when flying. The phrase used is spatial disorientation and it refers to any time your brain loses track of what direction your body (and the plane or car or whatever you are in) is aligned towards. In the case of the pilot, the body's senses will identify that the aircraft is doing something that it is not. Visual illusions may make the pilot feel that they are in a turn when the plane is going straight. Clouds may give an illusion of a false horizon which will make the pilot want turn or go straight. Flying into dense and dark clouds may make a pilot lose all perceptual reference and make them feel like they are flying horizontal and straight when they are actually spiralling toward the ground! Survival depends on trusting the plane's navigational instruments over what their perceptions and emotions tell them.

And so must we.

In our darkest days, in our most stormy days and depressed state we must trust God's promises, which are the navigational instruments He has given us over what our senses and emotions tell us.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know our Father whose promises never fail. May you all grow to love and serve Him with your whole heart and mind. May God grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.

Cares Concerns Worries Anxieties

The American psychological association defines anxiety as an emotion characterized by feelings of tension, worried thoughts and physical changes like increased blood pressure. Can you think about something that you could be concerned or worried about? God cares about you so much He wants to take away these feelings of tension, the worried thoughts that you may be carrying. He delights to show His power and His care by unburdening us.


We do however need to do something, cast them to Him. What does casting look like? The word to cast means "an act of throwing something forcefully".

How do we cast worries or concerns which we cannot physical throw? We do this by admitting that we have them and that we cannot take care of them ourselves. The forcefulness comes from choosing to trust in God who is stronger and wiser than us with them. Trusting that God delights to show His power and His care by unburdening us.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know our Father who is mighty, who lifts up and cares for His children. May you all grow to love and serve Him with your whole heart, you whole mind and bory. May God grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

I am accepted

When one has a child who is described as sensitive by his peers and teachers, one tends to see how deeply ingrained the need for showing up as perfect is in us. From childhood experiences that may plague us up to today, we may come up with a formula of being, behaving, talking or even thinking that others will accept. Depending on our personalities, we may hide or visibly display what others look down upon. We do this to protect ourselves from looking like we care too much, knowing that if they knew just how much we cared, they will have further grounds to reject us. So we play tough. Or we try to be invisible.

Our Father God welcomes E.V.E.R.Y.O.NE who comes to Him. He does not require us to clean up our act before we do so. He invites us to "Come". As we are.

But ... what about my shame, sorrows, fears, doubts, sins, brokenness, sickness, rebelliousness, proclivities, emotions, feelings, past, present?!?!? What about all these (and probably others that you alone could add)? To this, our Heavenly Father says "Come. You are accepted".

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know our welcoming and forgiving God. May you all grow to love and serve God with your whole heart and mind. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

This has got to be the definition of what love looks like. Love chooses always to be patient even when the other person frustrates them. Love chooses to be kind even when the other person is nasty and thoughtless. Love chooses to be generous even when triggered by jealous or malicious acts of rivalry. Love chooses to always forgive without counting how many times they have forgiven the person before. Love chooses to hopefully endure where there is pain.

This card reminds us that God chose to love us before we were good or chose to love Him. He did something to try to get our attention, show us how love looks like and remind us that He loves us still.


God does not change

When you bake a cake, you are mixing dry ingredients with wet ingredients and placing them in an oven to come up with something delicious that looks nothing like the different ingredients you started with. What exists in the world can easily be changed in form, shape or size by applying a force against it.

Unlike a cake or any other created thing, God's existence was not determined by any force outside of Himself. He existed before everything and before the beginning of time. He cannot be changed in any way through surprise, shock tactics or force. His integrity cannot be compromised.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in the knowledge of our heavenly Father who does not change. May you all grow to love and serve Him with all your hearts and minds. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

God exists

If God exists, then shouldn't He prove his existence beyond any doubt? Should He not make it obvious to everyone that He does exist? An intentional and conscious relationship with God requires one to believe in the existence of God, right? Since God wants us to have an intentional relationship with Him, shouldn't He do everything that He can to ensure that we believe that He exists? Why does pain, injustice and evil exist if God exists and is both good and mighty? If He really does exist, then there should be no pain, injustice and evil.

I believe that what we have learnt about God in these few cards can still help us unpack the truth that God exists to ourselves and our children.

- 1. Day 16. God existed as Himself before any other thing and therefore He is full, complete and not dependent on anything to prove that He exists.
- 2. Day 14. He is love. It is important to note that the word IS is different from the word HAS. When we use the word HAS we are referring to what is contained inside something. For example, a cup has water. There will be times when the cup will not have water and will need to be refilled again. God existed before pain, injustice and evil were introduced into the world. In day 16 we also discovered that God does not change. This means that when bad things are introduced in the world, it does not dilute or dissipate His being.
- 3. In both days 15 we saw how God is secure in Himself. He chose to love us before we loved him. This is who He is before we are and before choose to do.
- 4. In day 7, we again saw God's magnanimous nature when He gave us the choice to believe in Him and love Him.

Granted these four points do not say much about God's existence. What they do say is that God is who He is and not what we hope He does. If we see a situation around us that is unlike His nature, we cannot use that response to say that He does not exist. Instead, we need to be curious and seek to find out who He is.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in the knowledge of our heavenly Father who is. May you all grow to love and serve Him with all your hearts and minds. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

And God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And He said, "Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you."

With God I lack nothing

It would be easier for me to live out this affirmation if I had grown up understanding that the greatest desire, the greatest delight and the tastiest taste is God. "I lack nothing" would be easy to say then. It would be the truth that I lived and it would be that much easier to pass on this truth to my kids, to you and others.

In truth, my tastes draw me to want, my mind to imagine and my feelings to desire "good" things not God.

When the Shepherd leads me away from what I believe to the "good" thing, I follow - kicking and screaming. The "good" thing represents wants, wishes and dreams that I am unwilling to give up because I can taste them ... they are just a millimetre away from my reach. My mind and heart find it difficult to compute that the One who leads me is all that I need. He is enough. With Him I lack nothing.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May Our heavenly Father change the tastebuds of our hearts and renew our minds so that we may grow to yearn for Him above everything. May we grow to love and serve Him with all of our hearts and minds. May our heavenly Father grace us to nurture, equip, train and empower our children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

I believe in God

The fun thing about the bible is sometimes as you study the scripture within, information from certain subjects will come to mind. Or perhaps that is just me. I find that happening all the time. Take this scripture for instance. Jesus speaks about believing IN God and believing IN him. This throws me all the way back to English class on prepositions. There is a difference in believing someone and believing in someone.

We use the statement "I believe you" when responding to someone who has told us about something that happened, which they were privy to and we were not. For example, if you were asleep when the red sea parted and someone who was awake later explained to you how you all ended up on this side of the sea, you would say to them "I believe you" at the end of the story.

We would use the statement "I believe in you" when speaking to someone about something that they are yet to do to let them know that you have complete confidence in their ability and willingness to do it well.

Our heavenly Father invites us to not only believe Him but also believe IN Him.

Today, encourage the children in your circle of influence to read scripture slowly, paying special attention to the little words. Help them see how these little words can reveal more of what the bible has for us to feast on.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May the youngest of your children appreciate the impact of the little. May you all grow in the knowledge of our heavenly Father who longs to have you lean on Him fully. May you all grow to love and serve Him with all your hearts and minds. May our heavenly Father continue to grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

I am who God says I am

Who does God say that you are? What does He say about you? The message on this card invites us to relate to Him in the way that He sees us. We have learnt a little about who we are over the past three weeks (almost!) as listed below.

I am a child of God. I am chosen. I am a blessing. I am wonderfully made. I am made in God's image. I belong to God. I am valued. I am not my mistakes. I am accepted. I am loved.

The conversation to have today is, what thoughts would you think if you remembered that you are even one of these things? What would you do? What would you say?

Remember, what drives what we do helps reveal what is important to us. Perhaps what is important to us is not to be laughed at, because when we are laughed at we feel rejected and stupid and we find ourselves unable to fit in with our friends. This shows us that we value our friend's opinions over, say, attempting to answer a question in class. It shows that we worry about how other people see us. We worry about ourselves and how we appear to other people. We value what other people say about us.

This affirmation reminds us that we ought to value God and what He says about us over everyone. When we value God above everything, believing what He has said about us and choosing to think thoughts, do things and speak words that support this belief are the steps that will show that we value Him above everything. In doing so we will be worshipping Him.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in the knowledge of what our heavenly Father thinks and says about you. May you all grow to love and serve Him with all your hearts and minds. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

The first few times I read the story about David's battles, I thought that foreskins were scalps! In my defence, I was young and was not familiar with the male anatomy.


A limited understanding of something may lead us to inaccurate conclusions. My limited understanding of the male body and the sensitive skin of a princess led me to wrong conclusions.

The question could be, if God is in control and He works His purpose for the good of those who love Him, then doesn't this mean that God is primarily about Himself? And does that not mean that He is selfish?

Take a moment to follow through the argument to reveal that when we think of other people who only think about themselves then we are able to point out situations where they would make decisions that will only favour themselves, those who they want to please or their tribesmen. We have probably experienced this as two faced, manipulative and unjust. Should we then trust a being who cares primarily about himself?

Our understanding of love is that which puts human value and human well-being at the core. However, Love is doing what needs to be done to help people see and enjoy the glory of God forever. Love keeps God right at the centre because man's soul was made for God. Therefore, God is loving us when He is working His purpose. We may look upon Him to ask Him to give us what we desire, take away our hurt or prevent something from happening. He will consider our request in terms of how best to respond to ensure that His beloved sees and enjoys Him. Even when it means leaving us in a space of weakness. He lovingly reminds us that His grace is all that we need as our weakness is the door He needs to make the miraculous happen.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in boldness to acknowledge your weaknesses and allow God's might to be seen through them. May you all grow to love and serve Him with all of your heart, body and mind. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower your children to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

My personal belief is that whatever hurt we feel pales in comparison to the hurt God carries when He sees His beloved in pain. Think about it, how moved would you have to be to send your son in to die for people, setting them free when they choose to believe in Him?

God does. The one who hurts when you hurt does understand.

The one who is sad about exams can hug their friend and say, "I am so glad that I have a friend who inspires me to work hard like you" And the other can hug them back and say "I am so glad that I have a friend who encourages me and is kind like you"

We cannot grow in our own strength to be this loving to one another. Only God can help us mature in this way.

Do not give up.

Read the scripture on the second card slowly. A full life is promised by our heavenly Father who is kind, cares and is near. In fact, in this scripture it is stated as his responsibility, purpose and guarantee.

I wonder if the child (or young person) in your space is taking a little longer to get proficient in this like mine. It can get frustrating — scratch that. It often gets frustrating to me the highly methodical melancholic and he, the easy going phlegmatic/sanguine. Drives me four types of crazy, it does.

Question, in what way does our heavenly Father view us when we are in the same situation? Specifically, when we are searching for who we are. We tend to look for what defines us in the voices that speak the loudest. Often, unfortunately, the loudest voice in our ears is not His. Sometimes the anger, sadness or loneliness that we feel is much louder and we feel it consistently and more constantly than we experience peace and calm. Other times the needs, desires or wants from our bodies are much louder and lead us to believe that we could be our feelings. If we were not what we feel, why do we feel this so strongly ... or at all?

I find it amazing that our heavenly Father provided us with something that will help us not only to fight but also to reminds us of who we are. He anticipated our perplexity and need and gave us His Spirit, a constant presence who guides us to the truth.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow to know our heavenly Father who anticipates what we need and provides for them. May you all grow in trust of Him to love and serve Him with all your heart, body and soul. I am disciplined

Mum? What intrusive thoughts run through your mind? When my son asked this question the other day, I drew a blank. My brain could not compute. Why are we talking about intrusive thoughts? Do I have intrusive thoughts? Wait! Do I know what intrusive thoughts are?

Luckily for me, we were in the car and we had company so while company responded to the question, I got a chance to listen in and get schooled on what intrusive thoughts are. When my kids were infants, and I had left them at home with the caregiver, in the middle of some random piece of work I would have this image of them rolling off a chair or bed and falling onto the floor. This thought would often make me sit up straighter, reach for the phone and then I would hastily remind myself that if anything happened, the nanny would call me. Still I would be on edge for a while after that.

Affirmations when memorised and repeated, tend to affect someone the same way that intrusive thoughts do. Take this one for instance - I am disciplined. The first time you read it, it might not ring true about you or your child. That is quite alright. Make it a game. Memorise it, write it down and say it out loud often. What will happen is, it will be that intrusive thought that pops into your mind when you need to do something that calls for you to be disciplined.

I speak from experience. Often when I am lying in bed well after my alarm has gone off and in the middle of thinking deep thoughts like "Am I still tired? Should I sleep some more? Are both socks still on?".... the thought "I am disciplined" intrudes. It jars me awake and I bolt out of bed!

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in knowledge of a merciful Father who does not condemn. May this knowledge help you all to restart your consistency and training journey as often as you need to. May you all grow in discipline to serve and love our Father with all your body, heart and soul. May our heavenly Father grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower the children in your circle of influence to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine!

Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.

My older son taught me a profound lesson about obedience. When he was much younger, he had the simple chore of wiping dishes. I remember that whenever I would request him to wipe them, he would jump to it. Later on, I discovered from our helper that he would not respond in the same way to her requests to perform the same chore. When the instruction and duty never changes, can I refer to his character as obedient if he only responds positively to one adult and not the other? In my opinion, no. His actions -at that timewere dependent on who was giving him the instruction at that moment.

What does holiness have to do with obedience and light? Everything. We call God holy because His thoughts, words and actions towards His Son, Jesus are aligned. He is not two-faced, thinking one thing and doing something else. His thoughts, words and actions towards us, His children are also aligned in the very same way.

When we get into a relationship with our heavenly Father, we find that we are drawn more and more to be like Him. Unlike my son, we cannot pick which of His instructions to obey and which ones to ignore, when to obey and when not to. We can tell that our relationship with Him is growing when we are compelled from inside ourselves to obey Him in everything and at every time. In this way, our steady and consistent character stands out like light.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU: May you and your children grow in love of our Heavenly Father and as your relationship with Him grows, may your desire to please Him always increase. May you all grow in love to dedicate all yourselves to Him, withholding nothing. When we own something like an X-box or PlayStation, we are very protective over it. It could be hard for us to lend it to our friends. We often want them to guarantee that they will handle it as carefully as we do. If you observe closely you will notice that how our school mates or siblings treat our things reveals what they think of us. Think about it for a minute.

Is it possible to know what God desires? Yes. In day 6 we meditated on the scripture that reminds us that everything on earth belongs to God. One of His desires is for us to treat what belongs to Him the same way that He does. He desires that we love people and always think the best of them. He desires that our thoughts, words and actions towards them match. Our journey towards holiness starts when our thoughts, words and actions towards people begin to align. In addition, when we treat others with care and respect, we are reveal what we think of Him; that we value Him and all that belongs to Him.

For our kids to respond to us in a way that respects our values, we need to have a connection with them. The connection grows through our relating with them.

For our kids to respond in a way that respects God's values, they need to spend time relating with Him. They need to spend time in His word, hearing Him call out their virtues, growing confident in who He says they are to Him and building a connection with Him.

I might be off the mark here because most of the information I carry is from movies and novels however, I believe that a lot of intense training happens prior to initial deployment and training and conditioning continues in the periods between deployments.

Now what I suspect is that even when deployed to a station where the battle is taking place, all soldiers are not sent out at once and kept in the battle area the entire time. I suspect that there is a battle plan which states when a particular company will be engaged in battle, while another is resting in the camp. There might be various types of soldiers each with specific tasks that take place at different times. I imagine that there are times when you will find very highly trained soldiers at the base camp waiting for their specific instructions.

It is the same for followers of Christ. God has planned and is constantly sharing His plans with us. Our role is to listen and obey. At times He will speak and require us to carry out an assignment. At other times, when His time to deploy us is not yet, He will keep us waiting for His instructions even when we believe that we are ready and raring to go.

People claimed that if I turned sideways, I would disappear! The challenge for me growing up though was I did not know what to do with all the extra feet and inches. All my height seemed to do was to attract attention to itself. To me. I did not have to try, I stood out, literally.

Because I was so uncomfortable with my height, I tried to make myself invisible. I learnt how to be quiet when in public and wore baggy clothes. I tried to hunch my shoulders and slump into my seat. I tried to be like everyone else too in all other aspects so that nobody would realize that I was different from others in any way. You see, I thought that being the same as everyone else must be equal to being humble. Therefore, what made me different, stand out and noticeable defined me to be prideful. What sort of person would want to call attention to themselves? With their height? Or with something that they do differently from or better than others like draw, write, dance, sing or play?

The truth is, when you choose to follow Jesus, expect to stand out. The decisions you make, your actions and your desires will be different. There will be a transformation in who you are. If you work at not being seen to be different, it will only call attention to what you are trying to do to go against your new form. It will be inauthentic. So, for us who follow Christ, our transformation will be seen, should be seen and ought to be seen.

I conform to God

At the core, our actions and words show proof of what we believe. For example, a child learns that an open flame is to be avoided because it burns and burns are painful. Pain causes one to cry. Crying makes one look weak and therefore crying must be avoided. As the child grows, this thinking process is extended to any experience that is likely to lead to hurt. They learn to embrace experiences that protect one from discomfort and seek those that lead to pleasure.

Soon patterns of self-preservation and self-rejection emerge. Choice after choice is evaluated to determine if we are willing to bear the intensity of the hurt. Our history comes into play to give us evidence and "helps" us evaluate whether we want to bear the pain again. Often self-preservation wins. In the case where an experience will lead us into heady pleasures, we leap in and indulge — reasoning, "kesi baadaye" (we shall deal with the consequences later)!

Take a moment to observe the world around us. Notice how deeply similar patterns are enmeshed. Patterns of self-preservation, self- absorption, self-indulgence, self-sufficiency, self-protection, self-pity and many others driven by the self. This affirmation gives us an opportunity to stop and think about what God's actions reveal about His beliefs. He died a horrible death. His loss for our gain. Everything He did was for others. For us. On a maybe.

When we conform to Him. we start by believing what He believes. Our thoughts, words and actions change to match His belief system. We will often be called upon to sacrifice so that others can benefit. Then our lives give evidence of the good, acceptable and perfect will of God.

MY PRAYER FOR YOU:May you and your children let God change the way you think. May He transform your mind, connect with your intellect, heal your memories and reignite your imagination aligning it to His. May you all grow in believing what He believes and to love and serve Him with all your heart, mind, soul and strength. May He grace you to nurture, equip, train and empower the children in your circle of influence to do more for His kingdom than they can imagine.

And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

I am a leader

I love that our kids are growing up in an era that is different from the one we grew up in. I hear stories of schools conducting elections for what are now referred to as class representatives. In certain schools, the nominated candidates are taken through conversations to prepare them for the win or loss before the elections take place. In other schools the elected officials are taken on team building retreats where the baton is passed down from the previous ones. Impressive, right?

When I was in primary school, class representatives were known as prefects and their job was to try and keep the class quiet. If someone spoke, their name was written on a list and handed over to the teacher for punishment. I was a prefect when I was seven years old and remember being taught to appreciate the leadership maxim "As a leader, the buck stops with you". At that time, the head of discipline determined that the school's noise level were too high. Since the buck stopped with us, the prefects, he instructed that all us should be punished collectively during parade one morning.

Memories of lessons on leadership that were based on punishment (of others or self) may not be the reason why some of us may be unwilling to step up and officially lead. The reason may be more complex than this. However, when we try to make our way in the dark, we reach out for the lit lamp and hold it out in front of us to see the way.

You and your children are light. Encourage, affirm them and call out their leadership qualities whenever they display them.

We are saying that if the external factors favour our being kind then we shall be kind, if not we shall not be kind. Character, however, is consistent. It is not framed by a source external to ourselves. We choose to be kind and gentle whether or not others show up in the same way.

You are not what or how other people treat you. You are who God says you are. He is love. Love is kind. His heart is gentle and lowly. You are made in His image. The image of love, kindness and gentleness. You are therefore kind and gentle and you treat other people with kindness and gentleness in the same way that our heavenly Father treats us all with kindness and gentleness.



However, I think the better response to this story is to take a moment and think of all the times that our heavenly Father has extended grace towards you and continued to trust you to steward a resource or relationship. I pray that there will be a settling in your heart as you ponder over this.

Modelling this infront of them will help them watch meface and overcome odds on this journey, with our heavenly Father's help. Knowing that He will only be done with me when I am dead — and (perhaps) long after.

Some affirmations are best modelled. Modelling helps free our kids from the pressures of being perfect.


"But Caroline," you might protest. "Life is for living!"




